The four stained glass windows that were saved from the ladies lounge after the fire were carefully removed, placed in plywood and transported to Vermont back in January 2019. The windows were in bad shape, but salvageable. It was decided by the Site Planning Committee and the Board of Directors to spend the money to have the windows in our new building. The windows could no longer be used for outside, so they were refurbished to be hung in 3 areas in the church. Three of the windows had to be altered due to the damage that was sustained in the fire. Two of the windows were placed in the narthex on either side of the door entering the sanctuary. They are beautiful when the sun hits them! Another window was placed in the sanctuary above the chancellor area in the gable and is backlit. It is absolutely stunning! The fourth window was installed in the gable area in the community room. We are so thankful these windows could be salvaged.



Our new kitchen is beautiful!! Our stove has arrived; however, it is in the Community Room! It can't quite make the sharp turn into the kitchen, so will have to be partially disassembled to get it into its new home. There is plenty of counter space and ample cabinets! The center table was recovered from our old church with must elbow grease to clean it up. There are 2 storage areas, one pantry type area right in the kitchen and another bigger area that will be used for supplies and items not used on a weekly basis. Hospitality is lucky enough to also have an area in the Community Room with cabinets where we can set up all the coffee hour supplies and everything will be conveniently located for our fellowship time!
